

Will you help flip the turtle? Included Materials & Directions:

63 Situation Cards 3 Blank Card Templates

Print and Laminate. Cut to Separate.

Place cards face down on table. One at a time, students pick a card. Depending on grade level, I/the student reads the scenario out loud and then answers the "how would you help" questions.

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Here's how I use this:






Step#3: I play the game! Place face down on table. One at a time, students pick a card, read the scenario out loud and answers the question.
